



Why choose Navy Lacrosse Camp for your son?

- **STAFF.** Great camper to staff ratio (5.5 to 1 in previous years). Our camps are staffed by the Navy coaches, players, alumni, As well as college coaches, high school coaches & other select college players. Our coaching policy is centered on positive reinforcement. We want the campers to learn lacrosse, learn confidence and have a memorable experience.
- **SAFETY.** The Naval Academy is a secure naval base. Our dorms are watched and patrolled 24 hours a day. Campers are supervised at all times. There is a camper help desk located in our camp area that is manned by senior camp staff and medical trainers 24 hours a day. We have certified medical trainers on every field. Medical help is available 24 hours a day.
- **FACILITIES.** We have 18 premium grass fields, three astro-turf fields, four pools and two indoor field houses. We are better suited to handle inclement weather than nearly all other summer camps.
- **DORMS.** Our dorms are air conditioned and centrally located. We stay in Bancroft Hall- the same dorm as the midshipmen. All our campers are housed together in rooms of their choosing. Each room has its own shower and sink. The rooms vary in size from 2 – 6 campers. Dorms are supervised 24 hour a day. A medical trainer is located on each floor. A camper help desk (command center) is located in our dorm area. This command center is staffed 24 hours a day.
- **LACROSSE.** The Navy summer camp program has earned one of the best reputations in the industry. We are one of the last few camps that still focus on teaching and improvement. Our curriculum focuses on improving fundamentals, developing advanced skills and personal skills such as leadership and teamwork.
- **GREAT VACATION SPOT.** While your son lives the life of a midshipman, your family can vacation in Annapolis. We are located on the shores of the historic Chesapeake Bay.
